- Oliver has Cerebral Palsy
- Oliver has difficulty swallowing and is fed via a PEG G.
- Oliver's breathing is supported by home oxygen and his normal oxygen saturations are 88-90% on room air (greater than 94% on 1L O<sub>2</sub>).
- Oliver has seizures and is on regular anti-convulsant medication. Current seizure frequency 2x per month.
- He is PEG fed and has a daily feeding regime that his parent's manage with ongoing support from their dietician.

- Oliver has one older brother (Simon, 7) and one older sister (Rebecca, 5), who enjoy spending time with him.
- He is very attached to his paternal grandmother Fiona, who stays with the family during the week.

### Living and care arrangements

**Type of accommodation:** Semi-detached house.

**Lives with:** Mum and Dad (Clare and Edmund), brother (Simon) and sister (Rebecca). And grandmother (Fiona) stays Mon-Fri.

**Equipment:** Feeding equipment in the house and home oxygen concentrator.

### Symptom management plan :

- Oliver has a rescue plan for breakthrough seizures.
- Administer buccal Midazolam if seizures persists more than 5 minutes. Repeat if still fitting 10 minutes later and call ambulance.
